

We Worship with Confession.

Pastor: Remembering our baptism into Christ Jesus, we gather as we are to live in the name of the Father, and of the (⊕) Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Congregation: Amen.**

P: Beloved in the LORD, let us draw near with faithful hearts and confess our sins to God our Father, asking Him, in the name of our LORD Jesus Christ to grant us forgiveness.

P: Our help is in the name of the LORD. <u>C:</u> Who made heaven and earth.
P: I said, I will confess my sins unto the LORD. <u>C:</u> May God forgive the offense of my sin.

P: (facing altar which symbolizes God's presence): Almighty God, our Maker and Redeemer, C: we confess to You that we are by nature sinners and that we have sinned against You by thought, word and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. Therefore, we flee for refuge to Your infinite mercy, pleading for and seeking Your grace for the sake of our LORD Jesus Christ.

(Silence for personal reflection and self-examination.)

P: Most merciful God... C: You have given Your only begotten Son to die for us. Have mercy upon us, and for Jesus' sake grant us forgiveness of all our sins; and by Your Holy Spirit increase in us true knowledge of You and of Your will, and true obedience to Your Word, that by Your grace we may come to eternal life; through Jesus Christ our LORD. Amen.

P: (facing the congregation declares God's grace): Almighty God, our heavenly Father, has had mercy upon us, and has given His only Son to die for us, and for Jesus' sake God forgives us all our sins. To those who believe on Jesus' Name, He gives power to become children of God and bestows on them His Holy Spirit. Those who believe and are baptized shall be saved. Grant this, O LORD, unto us all. **C: Amen.**

All: Praise the LORD!

We are sent to make disciples of all nations (Matt. 28:19). We begin by sharing the peace of the LORD with one another.

Cantors sing verses 1-3, Congregation sings responsively the refrain.

Cantors: Vs 1- In our arrogance and pride We come to You. In our weakness and our guilt We look to You.

Congregation: O Lord, our Lord, Have mercy, O Lord, our Lord, Have mercy.

Cantors: Vs 2- In our trouble and our pain We come to You. In our darkness and our grief We look to You.

Congregation: O Lord, our Lord, Have mercy, O Lord, our Lord, Have mercy.

Cantors: Vs 3- Mighty God of love and power We come to You. You are here, and You are now. We look to You.

Congregation: O Lord, our Lord, Have mercy, O Lord, our Lord, Have mercy.

P: The grace of our LORD Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

C: And also with you.

Glory to God

Congregation: (Refrain)

Glory to God in the highest, Sing! Glory to God! Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on Earth!

Verse 1: Lord, God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father; We worship You, we give You thanks, we praise You for Your glory! **C**: (Refrain)

Verse 2: Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, You take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; You are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer! **C**: (Refrain)

Verse 3: <u>Women:</u> For You alone are the Holy One, <u>Men</u>: You alone are the Lord, the Most High, Jesus Christ, <u>All</u>: with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father! <u>C</u>: (Refrain)

P (spoken): The LORD be with you.

C: (spoken): And also with you.

PRAYER OF THE DAY (All pray):

Oh God, Keeper of our lives, You know the hardness and gentleness of human hearts. You call Your people to faithful living. Through the storms of life that bring suffering and fear, joy and laughter, teach us to turn to You for all we need, so that we may come to know Your presence even in the midst of the trials that surround us. In Jesus name we pray. Amen.

We Hear and Read God's Word

This reading is from The Book of Job, the 38th chapter

I will question you, and you make it known to me.

4 "Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth?

⁶ On what were its bases sunk, or who laid its cornerstone,

⁷ when the morning stars sang together and all the sons of God shouted for joy?

8 "Or who shut in the sea with doors when it burst out from the womb,

⁹ when I made clouds its garment and thick darkness its swaddling band.

¹⁰ and prescribed limits for it and set bars and doors.

and said, 'Thus far shall you come, and no farther, and here shall your proud waves be stayed'? (Here ends this reading)

This reading is from the Book of Psalms, the 107th Psalm.

(to be read responsively)

<u>Reader:</u> Oh, give thanks to the LORD, for he is good, <u>Congregation:</u> for his steadfast love endures forever!

R: ²Let the redeemed of the LORD say so, **C: whom he has redeemed from trouble**

R: ³ and gathered in from the lands,

<u>C:</u> from the east and from the west, from the north and from the south.

R: ²³ Some went down to the sea in ships,

C: doing business on the great waters;

R: ²⁴ they saw the deeds of the LORD, **C:** his wondrous works in the deep.

R: ²⁵ For he commanded and raised the stormy wind, <u>C:</u> which lifted up the waves of the sea.

R: ²⁶ They mounted up to heaven; they went down to the depths; **C:** their courage melted away in their evil plight;

R: ²⁷ they reeled and staggered like drunken men **C: and were at their wits' end.**

R: ²⁸ Then they cried to the LORD in their trouble,

C: and he delivered them from their distress.

R: ²⁹ He made the storm be still, **C: and the waves of the sea were hushed.**

R: ³⁰ Then they were glad that the waters were quiet, **C:** and he brought them to their desired haven.

R: ³¹ Let them thank the LORD for his steadfast love, **C:** for his wondrous works to the children of man!

R: 32 Let them extol him in the congregation of the people, C: and praise him in the assembly of the elders.

This reading is from Paul's 2nd Letter to the Corinthians, the 6th chapter (ESV)

Working together with him, then, we appeal to you not to receive the grace of God in vain. ² For he says,

"In a favorable time, I listened to you, and in a day of salvation I have helped you."

Behold, now is the favorable time; behold, now is the day of salvation. ³ We put no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, ⁴ but as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: by great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, ⁵ beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger; ⁶ by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, the Holy Spirit, genuine love; ⁷ by truthful speech, and the

power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; 8 through honor and dishonor, through slander and praise. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; 9 as unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and behold, we live; as punished, and yet not killed; 10 as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, yet possessing everything.

¹¹ We have spoken freely to you, Corinthians; our heart is wide open. ¹² You are not restricted by us, but you are restricted in your own affections. ¹³ In return (I speak as to children) widen your hearts also.

We Worship by Confessing Our Faith in the words of the Apostles' Creed

I BELIEVE in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth.

<u>Holy Communion</u>: Lutherans believe the LORD's Supper is a holy sacrament in which Christ comes to us with His grace, love, compassion, and forgiveness. The crucified and risen Christ is present in, with, and under the bread and wine – He promises: "This is my body... This is my blood". Therefore, the Apostle Paul says we should examine ourselves lest we eat or drink in an unworthy manner (1 Cor. 11:27ff.). Martin Luther wrote, "Anyone who does not believe these words ('this is My body given for you this is My blood shed for you.'), is neither prepared nor worthy; for the words, 'FOR YOU' requires simply a believing heart."

Therefore, all (including children who have received instruction) who believe in Jesus Christ as Savior and LORD and who see His presence in the sacrament are welcome to commune with us.

As you come forward for communion, you are invited to dip your fingers in the water of the baptismal font and then make the sign of the cross on your forehead as a reminder of Christ's claim upon you through your baptism.

(For those with gluten allergies, we now have gluten-free wafers available for Communion on the Baptismal Font.)



REPORT TO THE CONGREGATION JUNE 24, 2018

Committee & Ministry Reports:

From Board President:

We have just witnessed a good year. Our membership remains steady. Finances are meeting requirements and this congregation remains faithful. We maintained our tithe outreach thru the year and additionally made special offerings for hurricane relief twice, support for a police officer's family and a contribution to an abortion alternative ministry. Thank you!

Pastor Eric is hitting his stride in his ministry! As he finishes his second year with us we are all witness to his growth as a proclaimer of the Gospel. His outreach thru his newspaper articles have reached a large population outside our congregation. Remember to keep our pastor in your prayers.

This year we decided to pay our choir director, welcome to our staff Dan Owen. Our music ministry is growing with more musicians and a varied program. Keep up the good work.

For me the most exciting happening this year was the beginning of our outreach to Julian Estates. We have seen God's blessing of this outreach several times. We are, in effect, planting a non-denominational church at that facility with worship led by volunteers from our congregation. Close to 20% of our congregation is actively involved in this ministry. My prayer is that we can learn from and expand our outreach.

Property Acquisition Committee Report.

Members of the committee looked at several adequate pieces of property this year. Unfortunately, before anything could be done they were off the market. To facilitate the purchase process and to conserve or increase purchasing power of our building fund a task force was created and the congregation will be asked to authorize that task force and give it permission to act on behalf of Living Word Lutheran Church in whatever way the task force deems appropriate, to purchase property or to invest the building funds without missing a short window of opportunity by first having to hold a meeting with the prescribed notice to ask the Board or the congregation for permission. The task force has looked at St. Mark's Coptic Church in downtown Puyallup and is reviewing other properties. It is also starting conversations with local churches and others which have or have solved similar problems.

Benevolence Committee Report

Our committee supervises the distribution of 10% of our LWLC income to support Christian ministry in the local community and beyond. Approximately two thirds is given to local charities in the Puyallup, South Hill and Graham communities and one third is given to regional and national organizations to support their functions. Pastor's discretionary fund and contributions to LCMC are included in the benevolence budget.

As a consequence of variations in LWLC income, our committee has adjusted the level of support for some of our charities. We have increased our contributions to some local charities, selected a few new candidates for support, and deleted a few that had been previously suspended. A list of our current charitable contributions and brief accounts of their activities is available in the church office or from committee members.

Committee members are Bonnie Socey, Judy Williams, Sharon Johnson, Sharlene Parker, Gary Gjerstad, Skip Whelan, and Harold Liemohn, chairman. If you have recommendations for additional charities that we might support, please advise someone on our committee.

Bible Studies

Sharlene Parker lead the Busy Women's Bible Study Fellowship. It met monthly, October-June, the book/DVD used was "12 Women of the Bible". The timeframe was 6:30-8:30 pm on the second Friday and a potluck meal was enjoyed each time.

The Sunday am Adult Bible Study was hosted by Pastor Eric. Discipleship was one of the main topics and members met through May.

Wednesday morning classes, Living Way Bible Study classes met at the Krumwiede's home and the focus was on the Book of Romans. Wednesday evening Adult Bible study met from 6:45-8:00 pm. The topic was the Book of Acts with Ron Heilman facilitating.

Thursday at 8:00 a.m Men's Devotional Bible Study led by Skip Whelan *The mid-week Bible Study meets Thursday morning under Pastor Eric and the scripture reading for the upcoming Sunday is discussed.

Children's Program

Mary Loshbough led the Sunday School and chaired the teacher's meetings. The Sunday School program focused on two groups. The teachers and helpers alternate teaching responsibilities and children ranged in age from 4-12 years old. The final class for the school years was May 13th. The Rally Day theme was "Begin with Jesus and Branch Out". The Women's Ministry graciously provided lunch and the CEC helped the children with a pencil jar craft. On Oct 29, Bible Sunday was a special event. Three third graders, Carmen Ramos, Hannah Vashchenko and Viviana Vashchenko received their Bibles from their parent or significant mentor. Debbie Sandovil was the Chairman for our Samaritan's Purse outreach. Shoeboxes were sent overseas. Connie Hullstrom spent the December Sundays rehearsing with our children for a Christmas Program during worship December 17th. It was a very moving presentation and we were truly blessed by it!

On the 2nd Sundays, Lydia Auge gave the children's time message during worship. Lori Schmidt, Mary Loshbough, Randi Kilpack and Pastor Eric gave the message on the 4th Sundays.

Vacation Bible School

Lori Schmidt met with the pastor and secretary of Living Hope Church to pursue a possible joint effort for a July VBS program. The evening program would allow for kindergarten age children and older. The committee decided to forgo that venture and instead offer one Sunday School class in June, July and August at Living Word on Sunday after worship service for all ages of children.

Youth Ministry

They attend Pastor Eric's adult class on the remaining Sundays. Mary Kaye took the teens to the Columbia Gorge in July last year. They purchased art supplies to help support the Puyallup YMCA Youth Group.

Nursery Program

Nursery care is provided during the worship time. Kylie and Alexandra Steves have done an outstanding job of caring for the children of families attending service. This program continues throughout the church year.

Evangelism Committee

What a year for the Evangelism team! We started meeting regularly in March. Pastor, Debbie Zavadil, Skip Whelan, Gary Gjerstad, Tony Deas and Ron Heilman make up the committee.

Early on we identified people 55 years and older as our target for outreach. Julian Estates was still under construction and caught our eye, occupancy scheduled for October. Skip called Julian at the number beside the road. To our surprise we were called back immediately to discuss outreach possibilities. We met with an advance sales person, a Lutheran, the next day. God at work? He was going to pass on our contact information to the management team, that didn't happen. When management arrived, they went looking for a church to provide their services. They happened to contact Padre and Lin Jeffery as a possibility for services. They were referred to Pastor Eric and we were on track. Do we see the hand of God in this? Services started at Julian in January. Lay ministers from Living Word conduct the services. Near 20% of our congregation is involved in this outreach. On May 20th pastor conducted the first baptism at Julian Estates.

Pastor continues his messages in the News Tribune. This gives him an outreach to a wide area. Way to go Pastor! Our church website is being updated by Debbie Stankovich, one of our newest members.
