People are walking by with destinations in mind; looking at their phones or talking with their walking mates. Cars whiz by hurrying to get to this place or that. Many people claim to be Christians, but when push comes to shove, they back off in the interest of preserving the peace. It is one thing to know Jesus, but is Jesus the Lord and Savior of your whole life?

Don't get me wrong, I am not sitting here in this coffee shop with a holy than thou attitude. I am just concerned. There are many confessions of faith out there passing through the well-meaning lips of people but with no real-life change. Jesus is just a useful person in this life but *don't interfere too much, Jesus, I still like my sin.* Wearing a cross necklace and driving around with a "Jesus fish" decal on your car, doesn't make one a Christian. A true Jesus-following Christian is one who is changed from the inside out through the indwelling Holy Spirit. Being a Christian is having a whole new world view and life view. Being a Christian means that every single part of one's life is under the Lordship of Jesus. It's that simple. So, I sit here wondering, do you really know Jesus? He matters, truly matters and is worth following with your whole life. Why, because he saved your life through his death and resurrection. So, do you know THIS Jesus?
